Michelle F. Magee, MD, a board-certified endocrinologist, is Director of the MedStar Diabetes Institute (MDI), a division of MedStar Research Institute, and an Associate Professor of Medicine at the Georgetown University School of Medicine in Washington, DC.

As Director of MDI, Dr. Magee has clinical, education, and research responsibilities. She oversees and coordinates diabetes outpatient and hospital programs for the MedStar Health system in Washington, DC and Baltimore, Maryland. Dr. Magee serves as Co-Chair of the MedStar Glycemic Control Task Force, a major initiative targeting glycemic control in MedStar's seven hospitals. The MDI Diabetes Self Management Training (DSMT) programs are American Diabetes Association (ADA) recognized. In addition, she helped found the District of Columbia's *Diabetes for Life Learning Center*, at the Martin Luther King Memorial Library. This program offers free diabetes education services to community residents with diabetes and their families. She is actively involved with the Washington Hospital Center's (WHC) Diabetes Team.

Throughout her career, Dr. Magee has participated as an investigator in over 50 clinical studies. Since 2001, Dr. Magee has served as a Co-Principal Investigator for the NIH funded *Bypass Angioplasty Revascularization Investigation (BARI) Type 2 Diabetes (BARI 2D) Study* site at WHC, and was recently appointed Chair of the BARI 2D Gender Writing Group. She served on the ADA Writing Group on *Management of Hyperglycemia & Diabetes in the Hospital*, which helped set forward the current standards of care for glycemic control in diabetes inpatients and was published in *Diabetes Care* in 2004. She currently serves as an ADA representative to a Society of Hospital Medicine committee that is developing Web-based resources for management of hyperglycemia in the hospital. Dr. Magee's current research interests include diabetes related therapeutics and complications, hospital management of diabetes, cardiovascular disease, hypertension, lipids, and minority and gender disparities in diabetes care.

Dr. Magee received her Bachelor of Arts in Biology from Bryn Mawr College in Pennsylvania and her medical degree from the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland.

She completed her Internal Medicine Residency and Endocrinology and Metabolism Fellowship at George Washington University, where she remained on the Faculty for five years prior to moving to the MedStar Research Institute and WHC. Dr. Magee is the President of DC Metro Area Affiliate of the ADA and is a member of the Endocrine Society.

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
